Ursa Minor represents a small bear and is sometimes called the Little Dipper.



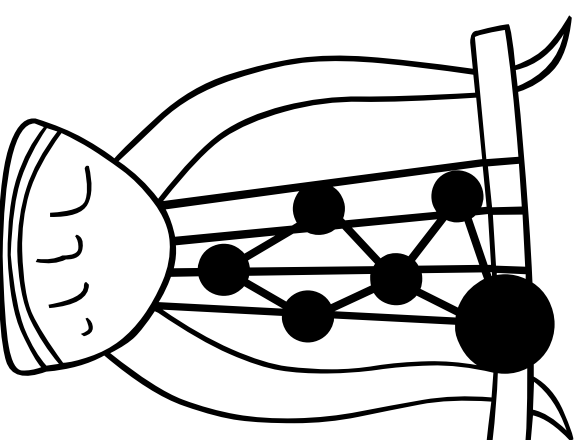

Lyra is a prominent constellation in the northern sky represents a harp that was said to be played by the legendary Greek musician Orpheus.



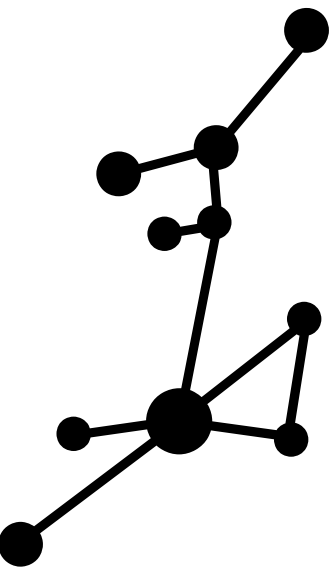

Hercules is a constellation in the northern part of the sky representing the mythological Hercules of Greek mythology.



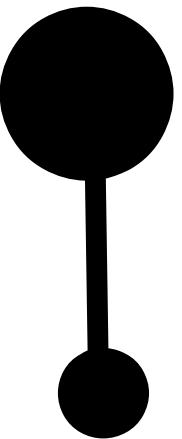

In Greek mythology, Draco represents the Dragon that was killed by Hercules as one of his 12 labors.



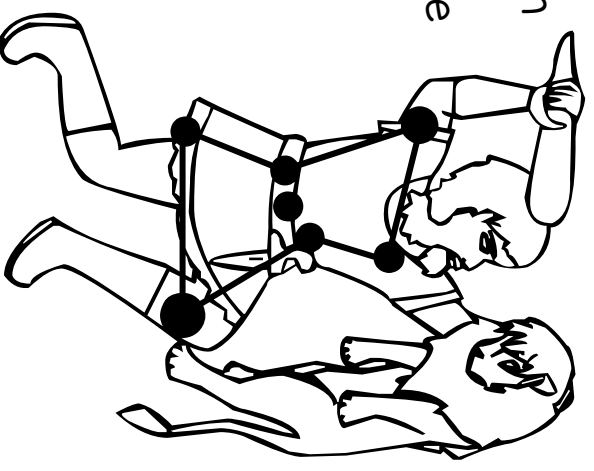

Canis Minor is a small constellation in the northern sky. Its name means "the smaller dog" represents one of the dogs following Orion, the hunter in Greek mythology.

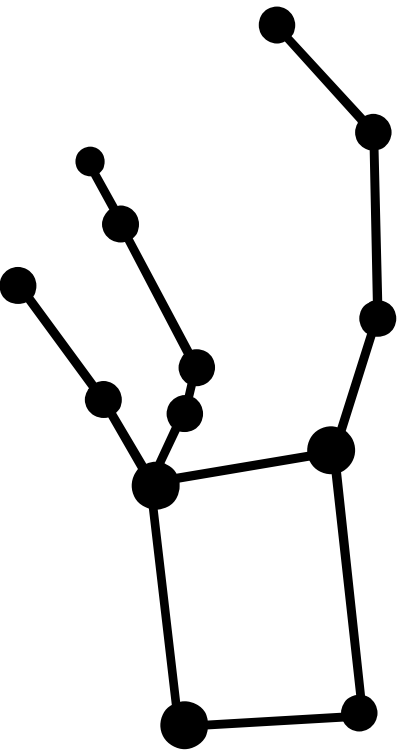

The constellation has a clear hour-glass shape with "Orion's Belt" in the center. That part is made up of three bright in line.



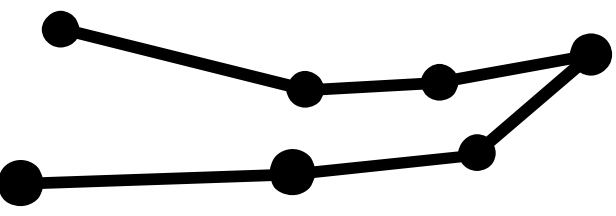

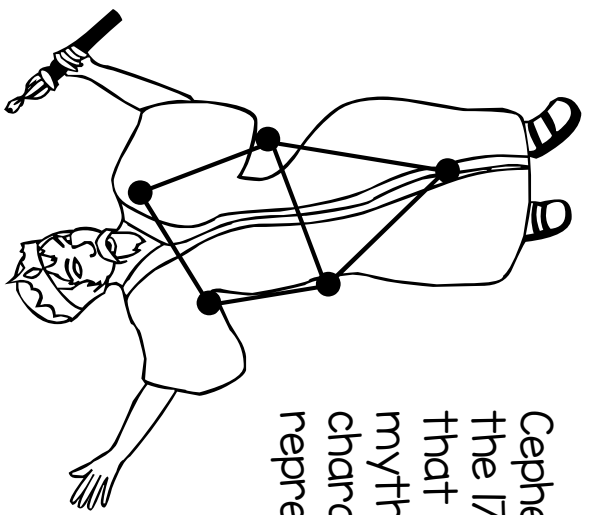


Pegasus is made up of more than 20 stars, but most of the time, people are only looking at the brightest stars that make up the front part of his body and his head.

Andromeda is a constellation in the northern sky. It is named after the princess Andromeda in Greek mythology



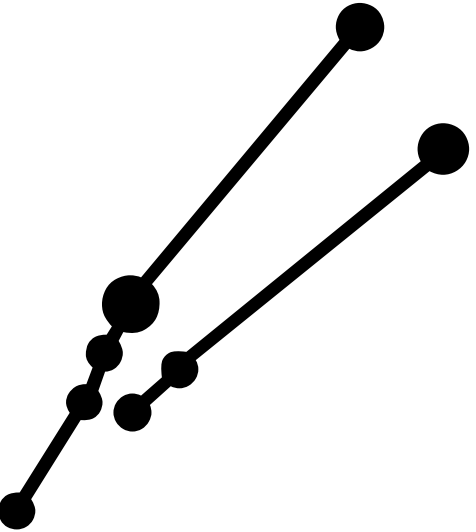
Cepheus is one of the 17 constellations that represents a mythological character represents a king



In Greek mythology, Aquila represents an Eagle associated with the god Zeus. The Eagle appears to be swooping down towards constellation Aquarius

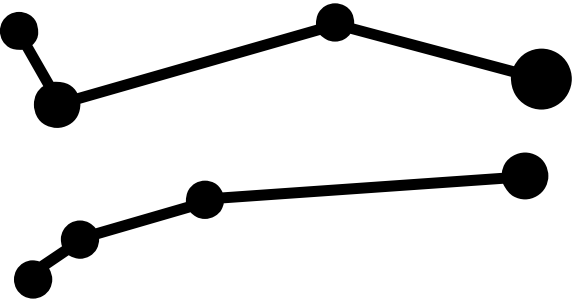

Virgo is one of the 48 constellations first cataloged by the Greek astronomer Ptolemy in the second century. Its name means "virgin" in Latin.



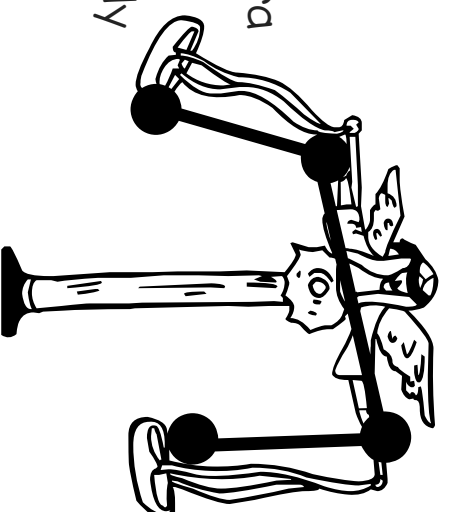

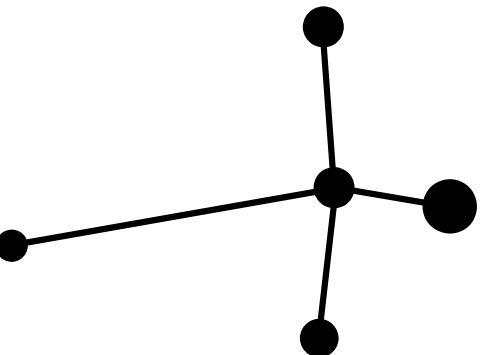

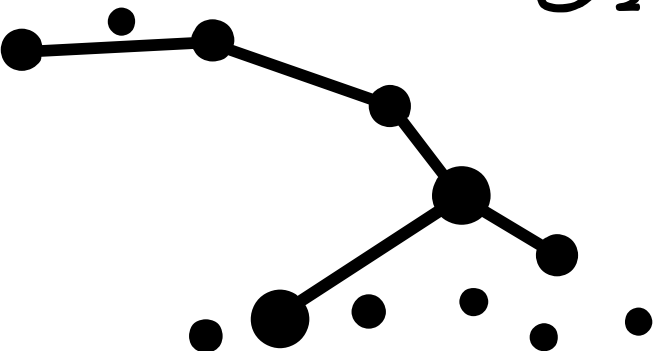

The Northern Cross is what's known as an asterism. In other words, it's not a constellation but simply a noticeable pattern of stars.



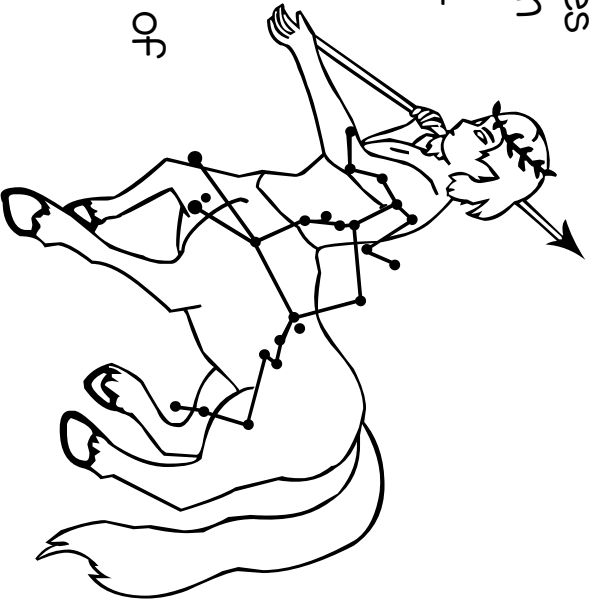
